#### HEADS UP FOR OUR NEXT WORKSHOP WITH SYLVIA EINSTEIN!

Following our November 19 meeting, we are excited that Sylvia Einstein will give us a workshop on Thursday, November 20 at St. John's Lutheran in Sudbury. The workshop, Circlemania, is described by Sylvia as follows: "Quarter circles are endlessly fascinating, they can be pieced in rounds, off-center, or traditionally, they can meander across the surface or in an intuitive way with backgrounds from light to dark creating paths. We'll design with bigger blocks for dramatic effect and ease of sewing. The focus of my classes is manipulating large-scale printed and unusual fabrics but subtle effects are also possible."

Fee for this class will be \$40.00 and your check to CPM will be your registration. Registration is currently open.
