The quilt show is coming along just fine. Ruth Flynn has the data done. Marian is working on the book. Laurie is still in high gear with publicity, getting the word out into newspapers and counting on you to place posters and bookmarks.

Lois has asked that members bring in their folded quilts with the label showing on the outside. When you get to the registration table, please have your quilts out of their bags and ready to have their sticker pinned to the label. You can then put them back in their respective bags and place them in their section.

Things to remember for the show:

- 1. Finish your quilts and make the label very important to identifying your quilt. Bring in your quilts on Thursday, Oct.15 7:30-10:30 A.M.
- 2. Staple the picture to the bag. There will be bags for those of you who have not picked them up. Be prepared to take a few minutes to set them up.
- 3. Fill your cookie tins with one dozen cookies in a plastic bag, placed in a tin and covered with a fat quarter. Include a label that says "nuts" or "no nuts." (Martha Supnik has lots of extra containers if you need some!)
- 4. Remember your volunteer times and show up a few minutes before.
- 5. Gather your items for the guild shop and fill out the consignment form.
- 6. Send out the postcards to your friends.
- 7. Place the bookmarks where you said you would and check back to make sure they are well-supplied.
- 8. Bring a dish to the kitchen to feed members who are working.
- 9. Do your holiday shopping at our vendors and guild tables and treat yourself to fabric, nickel squares, cookies and a great bag to hold it all.
- 10. Come and enjoy the quilt show for which we have all worked so hard to make a success.

Gift Shop

Concord Piecemakers will again have a gift shop during the quilt show for selling items that our members have made. Members can do one of the following: donate 100% of their profit to the guild, donate 20% to the guild and retain 80% for themselves, or donate 100% on certain items but 20% on others.

Everyone who puts items into the gift shop must list all of those items on an inventory form. An inventory form is included at the end of this newsletter. We do not price items. We cannot accept items that are not listed on the inventory form. Each item submitted must have a tag. The tag must include the code of the person submitting the item (such as initials), the number of the line on the inventory form for that item and its price. There is a column on the inventory form to indicate whether the item listed on that line is a donation to the guild (Y) or not (N).

Items that have been good sellers in the past are pillows, placemats, napkins, potholders, bibs, hats, small change purses, doll quilts, Christmas ornaments, sewing tool cases, glasses cases, scarves, jewelry, and small quilts (lap or baby).
