
Our speaker this month is **Pat Delaney** of Crabtree Lane Studios.


Quilt Show 2013

A big thanks to all who helped with the raffle quilt at The Gathering and Oktoberfest.



Where can you see over hundreds and hundreds of beautiful quilts displayed in one venue? Where can you find over hundreds and hundreds of vendors gathered in one place? Where can you say at the end of the day "I'm shopped out and my eyes can't look at one more beautiful quilt" but the next day be ready to start over again? Then after three days of shopping and viewing you can find a quilt you hadn't seen before or a vendor who has just the perfect piece of fabric.

All this was done by at the **International Quilt Festival** in Houston, TX. Hurricane Sandy could not keep several CPM members from attending this years' show at the George R Brown Convention Center.

The show draws 60,000 attendees and is over five blocks long and a block and a half wide. Huge doesn't begin to describe the space. Quilts from around the world were on display with enough room to allow the viewer to get close up or to stand back for a different perspective. Several first timers commented that no one was looking at the quilts. In reality many were looking but the area was so large there was ample space for all to view comfortably.

With a little planning one can avoid the long lines to enter at ten o'clock when the show opens. With a little planning one can keep track of travel friends while each goes her own way. With a little planning and exploring one can find fun places to eat.
