The Pilgrim/Roy collection at the MFA this spring is an impressive display of form, color and resourcefulness. Each section of the exhibit is paired with artwork that reflects the shapes and colors of the quilts.

The quilts, representing a small fraction of the collection, inspired me each time to look at traditional designs differently.

The log cabin quilts were so intricate and finely pieced. The quilters used what they had, repurposing clothing, ties, and decorative fabrics into quilts that lasted. There were no rules about what styles of fabric could be used together.

Non-quilting friends have come up to me and raved about the exhibit. They were even more impressed when I told them that Gerald Roy had been a speaker at CPM and that I had taken his color workshop.
