#### Workshop

Elin will also be offering a workshop on Thursday, September 18th,

9:30-3:30, titled "Fabric Collage." The cost of the workshop is \$30 and is limited to 20 attendees.

In this workshop, students will learn design fundamentals by creating a collage with a photograph or other image (printed or transferred onto fabric) as a central focal point as well as experiment with abstract collage compositions, learn construction techniques and how to incorporate found objects and ephemera into their collages.


#### Fabric Yard Sale SATURDAY, October 18 9am-2pm

### **Small Quilt Group**

We hope everyone had a relaxing and rejuvenating summer. As a kick off to the first meeting, we would like to start a small quilt group get-together. We are calling our group "Modern Emotions". With that name, we are sure you can guess what type of block patterns we will be using.

Over the years, we have spent many days sewing and working together on projects. Even when we choose the same pattern we both put our individual "stamp" on the choice of fabrics and enjoy the camaraderie and inspiration of each other. We thought this small group would be a great opportunity to see the direction each quilter takes with a focus fabric and quilt pattern. We would like to get together periodically to share each other's inspiration and creative style.

The quilt blocks we choose will have a modern contemporary feel. The fabric and color selections we have chosen evoke an emotion. Some emotions to be portrayed in the blocks are "peaceful","poetic" and "enchanting". Each month we will provide a "focus" fabric, an emotion, and a different block pattern. The rest is up to the group, within the color palette provided, to create a 12.5 x 12.5 quilt square. We will get together every few months to share our quilt creations and plan for the next square.

Our hope for those participating is to enjoy a small quilting group, inspire each other, and create a block of the month quilt to be displayed in the October 2015 Quilt Show.

We are limiting participation to 15 people so we can easily obtain materials. A nominal fee will be charged to cover the cost of the fabric.

We have already chosen the blocks, focus fabrics, and "emotion" to be portrayed and would like to get the small group started in September.
