The Quilt Side

This last month Pat Pauly shared her work and techniques with us. The workshop was intense, learning color and freezer paper pattern work. Aside from the big leaf, which is sitting in disarray in a basket, the pattern concept is very useful for future quilts. Her machine quilting was very modern, stressing thread color choices and multiple color changes.

A guild member was impressed with the many years that it takes to create a show quilt. She suggested slowing down, making fewer quilts by concentrating on techniques and design. It has taken me many years to collect my husband's shirts, a snap of inspiration from a speaker to figure out the design, and many hours just executing the center of the quilt. I slowed down, corrected many errors and tried to get my mind to sort out the direction of triangles and seams. No pattern means I own my mistakes, repeatedly. I have a name for the quilt, "The No Yellow Shirt Quilt". A secret – yellow would have been too much!
