Do you hear it? Do you feel it? There is a definite "buzz" of excitement in the air. We are just days away from our Biennial Quilt Show, our members have really stepped up to volunteer, and this show is on course to be exceptional. Why not invite your family, friends and neighbors. Let them see what Concord Piecemakers is all about.

Much thought has gone into this month's challenge to you. Certainly most of us set personal goals: spend more time creating quilts, make changes to improve our health, spend more time creating quilts (this goal can never be mentioned too often). A personal goal set by me in January was to take random and leftover blocks I have acquired and make them into comfort quilts. In order to get myself rolling, an adorable pieced lamb block was selected as my first effort. Armed with only one block someone else had made, I drafted a pattern and made 4 more blocks. After assembling them into the quilt top I spent days deciding how to machine quilt this little gem (I'm quite a novice in this area). I'm sorry to say, that quilt still waits patiently in my studio for its quilting and finishing touches. I give myself (metaphorically) a gold star for setting a goal and acting upon it. However, my follow-through to completion has fallen short.

This quilt came to mind while attending Victoria Findley Wolfe's workshop in September where she encouraged us to resurrect our leftover blocks and use them in "making" fabric. Bingo! Inspiration! I know I have many more blocks that could be put to use in this manner; all while experimenting with this new technique learned in Victoria's workshop.

My challenge to you is to locate extra blocks you may have hanging around from a past project and attempt to work it into a quilt or "make" it into fabric. No leftover blocks hanging around? Why not pick up an unfinished project and take it to completion. My goal to myself is to finally belly up to my Juki and put that quilting plan into action on my lamb quilt.



CPM Quilt Show

It is time for our quilt show and it is looking wonderful, thanks to all of you. Here are a few things to remember:

Wednesday night: Be at St. Matthews by 6:30 PM to help with hymnals, chairs, couches and other furniture. Sue Lee will be instructing us.

Thursday morning: quilt registration and Boutique will begin their intake from 8 AM-10 AM. Campbell Hall and the Sanctuary will be closed during the hanging of the quilts.

Decorations should plan on going into place AFTER the show is hung (probably close to noon). **Committee chairs** can set up their areas of responsibility on Thursday as long as they don't need to enter Campbell Hall or the Sanctuary while the show is being hung. **Vendors** arrive around 3 PM

During the show:

- <u>Parking on Friday</u>: Drive around the church (heading) towards the exit and you'll see a door and a walkway. Members and vendors should park there on FRIDAY and enter that door.
- Parking on Saturday <u>temporarily</u> park near the door indicated above and wait for a driver to guide you to the parking lot down the street and you will be shuttled back to the church. Preferably, **drive directly to the parking lot** down the street and there should be a car there to shuttle you back to the church. We'll try to keep a car at that lot from 9-1:00. If you come before or after that on Saturday, stop by the door near the parking lot exit and ask for a ride. (Do you have someone who would like to help with the "shuttle" driving? Give us a call)
- Pick up your **nametag** at Admissions and if you are volunteering, wear your **CPM apron** or borrow one from the box in the kitchen.
- Familiarize yourself with the **map** so you know where things are for our guests.
- Feel free to **stop by** different areas to see if you can lend a hand if you're not signed up for something specific. The volunteer sign-up sheets will be posted in the kitchen if you forget where you signed up.
- Hungry? The kitchen is the place to pick up food for members and vendors. You can direct guests to our Café.
- Drawings for Raffle Baskets and Raffle Quilts will occur at **3 PM on Saturday**.
- Show closes at **4 PM** on Saturday; quilts will be taken down by the assigned committee.
- Bring food for our volunteers anything is fine and deliver it to the kitchen.
- Bake and bring cookies for sale.
- Have a **vacuum cleaner**? Feel free to bring it along for clean-up after the show (4 PM). Not sure where you can help? Ask. After we get the go-ahead for a clean and organized church, we'll start quilt distribution on the 4th "level".
