

If you missed the Caryl Bryer Fallert exhibit you truly lost an opportunity to see an incredible exhibit of quilts. We as quilters are so fortunate to have such a lovely museum so close that is devoted entirely to the craft of quilting; an art form we love so much. Not too long ago I became a member of the NEQM and have learned that I truly am thankful for this gem of a resource that is devoted solely to my favorite thing; quilts! If you currently are not a member of the museum you should consider becoming a member. If you are currently a member, you may want to consider a donation to the museum when you consider your donation "opportunities" for the year. Relying solely on donations and funds generated from attendance and their gift shop sales means the museum quite often is running low on funds. Their major donation "pool" is mostly limited to quilters so they aren't considered for donations by as many people like other charities and groups.

My challenge to all of you this month is to become a member of the New England Quilt Museum and/or consider the museum as a recipient of your annual donations. Their website also provides other means of supporting the museum through volunteering and donating quilts. Our guild's constitution states, "Concord Piecemakers is a nonprofit organization dedicated to preserving, promoting and advancing the art of quilt making..." What better way to advance the art of quilt making by supporting this jewel of a resource.

While we are on the subject of thankfulness, our Challenge this year is to make a quilt that celebrates everything you love and are thankful for being a member of the Concord Piecemakers. In addition to being restricted to a quilt size no larger than 100" (total of all sides), we are adding a few other requirements to make the challenge more interesting. Being the 35th year we would like all quilts to incorporate the numbers 3 & 5 somewhere in the design. Also, coral is the traditional color for the 35th year anniversary. Please incorporate the color coral into your quilts. We would like to share these at our June 2016 meeting so don't wait too long to get started!





November 18 – Speaker: Marianne Elizabeth, Vintage and Vogue




