Thank you to Judy C. for agreeing to chair the sleepover. Think about staying overnight in the church and having your own private showing. Bring some handwork, knitting, a book and enjoy the company.

At the April and May meetings you will get quilt show information packets and have the opportunity of signing up for volunteer slots at the show. It may seem early, but it helps the guild be organized. For working members, there are jobs that can be done after work: set up the church on Wednesday evening before the show and all day Saturday.

Some members have told me that in the process of sorting fabric for nickel squares, they have also gone through quilt books and magazines. Kathy B. will be collecting books and magazines at our meetings through September. These will be sold at the quilt show.

We hope that your quilts and challenge theme houses are progressing. Remember to register your quilts with **two photos by September 1**. Mail them to Tina V. or email forms to her. You will still need to mail photos to her.

Nickel Squares Barbara Weiss

We hit a record for sorting and packaging nickel squares – 46. We are at 130 new packs of fabric and hope to get to 200. That means we need 7000 new nickel squares.

The committee will accept squares through the June meeting. Please look at your fabric and cut up good stuff to sell. We need the following types of fabric: Kaffe, batiks, I spy variety (or what is called Character Fabric), modern brights, florals, small prints, background fabric of creams, white, beige in larger multiples.

After June, if you wish to contribute squares, you will need to bundle 100 per pack, with good variety, and tie it with a ribbon. These can be donated at the September meeting.
