How I Get from A to B (the evolution of ideas): Lynn will talk about how the ideas she gets turn into original quilts – how she gets from A to B. How to start with an idea, play with it, push it around, turn it on its head, and make a quilt from that. She'll talk about how sometimes she takes a detour, and sometimes she changes direction completely. Sometimes she makes the same basic design two or three times, but makes it different each time.



We have no specific rules or format in mind and if you would email us your interest, we would plan a get-together to discuss how/when to meet, frequency of meeting, and what to do when we meet. #### QUILT SHOW 2017

Our team has already designed the quilt show with all the wonderful quilts that were submitted. Here are some of the humorous titles: Ring for Toilet Paper, 36 Shades of Black, A Warm Day at the South Pole, Sushi Tonight, A Live Hat, Will Work for Fabric.

You have all received the information packet with instructions for registration and show details. To recap: **September 28** is the last day to withdraw a quilt or wearable from the show. If you miss this deadline, consider yourself chained to the sewing machine until you are done.

Volunteer Sign Up Clipboards – We have had a good response so far. The sign up boards will be at the next meeting. After this, Joy will send out an email to show where we still need slots filled. Remember to fill in your schedule sheet so you know where to go and when.

Publicity: Barbara Tarlow has more cards and posters to advertise the show. She has also emailed CPM members the poster to send on to friends. Invite everyone you know so that we have a successful turnout. There may be two other shows on our date.

October 12, Thursday, 8-10 A.M. – drop off your quilt, wearable or tuffet in the front lobby. Have the quilt folded so the label shows. After identifying stickers are put on your quilt, take it to the bag table and put it into the brown bag with your name and section number. From there, place your quilt bag in the corresponding section indicated by a sign on the wall in the lobby area. If you are staying to hang the quilts, enjoy some breakfast.

October 14, Saturday, Pick up your quilt between 5:00 and 5:30. We are hoping to distribute quilts in the lobby area in a taped off area. No quilts will be distributed until the church is clean and set back together. Offer to help with clean up. There are always many small jobs.

Vendor set up time is on Thursday, 1:00. The guild will have the following stations: Boutique, Nickel Squares, Raffle Quilt, Cookie Cans(in the downstairs entry with admissions), Books and Magazines, Admissions in the downstairs entry, Coffee Shop, Vintage quilts, Demonstration Room, Scavenger Hunt Table, Comfort quilts display, two vendors and Quilts of Valor.

#### Friday Oct. 13th:


Breakfast: Member contributions
