September 26 - Elizabeth Sylvan: Constructing a Landscape Using Raw Edge Applique

Watch while Elizabeth lays out a landscape collage in front of our guild. Done on an easel, this presentation will take the audience through the steps and processes that Elizabeth uses to create her fabulous landscapes. Handouts will be given out on design concepts, tips, and finishing touches that will make your landscape pop. Bring a pen if you want to make any notes on a technique that inspires you.

A quilter of over 20 years, Elizabeth specializes in landscape collage art quilts. She will discuss basic principles of design while laying out a sample landscape, working from back to front after the style of watercolor painting. Treasurer's Update – Mary Jalenak

The guild would like to thank two members for designating Concord Piecemakers as recipients of grant funds for their volunteer service. Maura Cain and Cathy Bakinowski applied for funding from their employer and also submitted proposals for how they would like the money to be used. Maura's grant will go toward quilting of comfort quilts at Electric Quilters in Burlington while Cathy's grant will be used to purchase cutting mats, irons, and other supplies to be used at the Getaway, Quiltathon, Open Sew and workshops. Sue Colwell has graciously volunteered to store these items at the Congregational Church in Harvard (where the Open Sews are held) and make sure the items get transported to other events.

Donations to the guild are always welcome. If your employer offers funding for volunteer service, I am happy to help with the application process.

COMFORT QUILTS

"Dear Quilters, As a new patient to Emerson Hospital's Infusion Center I happily received a beautiful quilt from my R.N., Amy. Thank you for your generosity."

Since our quiltathon in February, we have donated 38 quilts to Emerson Hospital's Bethke Center, Bedford V.A., Care Dimensions Hospice House, and our newest recipient organization, Wrap-A-Smile, an international organization that provides quilts to children receiving cleft palate reconstructive surgery.

Wrap-A-Smile has hand crafted stunning children's quilts for Rotaplast to send on missions. Each child that is treated on a Rotaplast mission takes home a beautiful quilt of his or her own. These quilts provide not just warmth, but also allow children and their families to take home a token of love to remember the day they were given a new smile. Each year, Wrap-A-Smile provides Rotaplast with more than 1,500 quilts to bring to 48 rotating sites worldwide.

We are poised to donate 26 more to some of the same organizations listed above, as well as to Rosie's Place, and House of Hope (Lowell).
