The first weekend in October is our every other year quilt show. The show is Friday October 4 and Saturday October 5.

1. Register your quilt(s). You can help the process by registering now rather than waiting.

2. If you haven't done so already, pick up your registration packet. If you are not at the meeting and want a registration packet we can send one out by email. The registration packet is also available on our website. If you have no access to a printer and want a packet, please contact Pam and arrangements can be made to get a hard copy to you.

3. Sign up to volunteer. We have had a great response from our volunteers, however, there are still slots needing people.

4. We have a wonderful new opportunity this year, to help with making miniquilts for sale. There will be more information about this at our June sewing Saturday and at the regular guild meeting. Elana and Ellen have been hard at work on this project and would love some help.

5. Please tell all your friends and anyone else about our quilt show. You might want to mention that in addition to the quilts that our members will have hanging in the show, the comfort quilts will also be available for special showing by asking at check-in. People who get told about what we do as a guild, including the comfort quilts that we make, become more interested in coming to the show.

6. Please make a note that the deadline to register for the show is <u>before</u> our September meeting. **Deadline: Sunday, September 1**st

Nickel Squares

This is the last month that we will be collecting nickel squares for our quilt show table. We have enough "I Spy", Christmas, plaid squares. We could use batik, floral, Kaffe, cream in multiples and red, white and blue.

So far our count is:

134 new nickel squares packs, 6 jelly rolls, 25 layer cakes and 72 nickel squares packs from the last show. Many of the leftover packs will be on sale at the show.

If you have a nickel square project in the works or completed, we would love to display it to give quilters ideas and encourage sales. A new demo technique would also be helpful. Disappearing four patch and some star squares are what we have to demo on a flannel board.

You can see that our volunteers have worked hard over the last year to package 13,400 nickel squares. Thank you to everyone who showed up, had fun and got to know each other around the lunch table.
