Trunk Show: Give it a Scrap Slap

A look inside my yearlong stint as a member of the Quiltmaker Magazine "Scrap Squad," a select group of 6 quilters from across the continent tasked with redesigning one pattern from each issue entirely in scraps. Each assignment led me not only into the morass of scrap hoarding in my own studio, but also inspired me to create several of my own designs based on the originally assigned projects.

Now YOU Give it a Scrap Slap! Workshop Thursday, September 19th

Thursday, September 19th

9 a.m. at the Congregational Church, 5 Still River Rd., Harvard.

In this three hour hands on workshop, we put the concepts discussed in the Give it a Scrap Slap lecture to the test by reworking a given block entirely in scraps. While all class members will work with the same block design, each person will be given different directions on color, value, contrast, and fabric placement to be used in their block as they sew. All fabrics are brought to the class as 3 inch squares and are put into a scrap pool, upping the scrappy fun of the completed blocks immensely! Participants will be taught the importance of value and creativity when choosing block fabrics, and in the end will be amazed by how one block can be transformed into so many different looks simply with fabric choices and placements. If time permits, participants will make a second scrappy block with no given "map" of color, value, contrast, etc just their own scrap interpretations!

There are still spots available at the workshop if members want to join. The fabric prep is not complicated and the fabric can come from your stash. Contact Elana at 978-692-7906 or <u>lahsch@verizon.net</u>.

We will have the workshop space for the whole day so you can continue to work on the exercises from the morning to get a better understanding of the principles or you could bring a different project. All are welcome to come and sew in the afternoon!

It's hard to believe but our 2019 Quilt Show is quickly approaching. The quilt show design crew is busy developing the layout of the show utilizing the beautiful selection of quilts registered by our members. Thank you to everyone who submitted quilts. For those of you who didn't submit any quilts for our show, make that a personal goal of yours for the 2021 show. Two years always seems like a long time to create quilts for the show but of course many of us still end up frantically quilting in September for the October show.

Below are important dates to remember:

September 18, 2019 (Wednesday) This is our last guild meeting prior to the quilt show. We will have the Volunteer Sign Up sheets available at this meeting. There are many vacant time slots for many areas of the show. Please come prepared to sign up for multiple jobs and timeframes if you haven't already done so. We need everyone to volunteer! Many jobs are sitting jobs!

September 26, 2019 (Thursday) – this is the last day you are able to withdraw your quilt or wearable from the show. Be sure to contact Barbara Tarlow or Leslie Vieth if you find your quilt won't be ready for the show.

October 2, 2019 (Wednesday) – 5pm we will start to prepare the church for our show. This entails moving furniture to make way for the quilt racks. Everyone is invited to come and help.

October 3, 2019 (Thursday) – Drop off your quilts and wearable items for the show. Where: St Matthew's Church, 435 Central St, Acton – tables will be set up for this in the front lobby of the church. Drop off will be from 8am – 10am.

Please be sure your quilts have labels on the back and hanging sleeves! Be sure to fold your quilt so the label is visible.

October 3, 2019 (Thursday) Vendor setup will begin at 1pm

October 4, 2019 (Friday) Quilt Show open from 9am-6pm

October 5, 2019 (Saturday) Quilt Show open from 9am-4pm

October 5, 2019 ((Saturday) Pick up your quilts and wearables after the show. Remember: Distribution of quilts will only happen once the clean-up of the church is complete! Possibly by 5 or 5:30pm.

Be sure to set your date reminders in your calendar.

Our quilt show will include the following stations:

Lower Entry level – Admissions, guild info table, Cookie Sales & Used Books/Magazine Sales

Upper Level – Quilts of Valor & the CPM Raffle Quilt tables (both in hallway outside of Campbell Hall). In the Reception area will be our 2 vendors, Fabritique and Follow That Thread, along with Nickel Square Sales & the Boutique which will also include our 5"x8" mini quilts.
