On Saturday January 16th 11-noon Kathryn will talk about fabric for Fashionistas so you can pull from your stash. You will need a 14"x14" piece of Pellon or something similar-stiff is preferred. Everything else I'm sure you already have.

On Sunday January 17th, 11 AM - 4 p.m. Kathryn will teach us how to make Fashionistas: paper dolls for grown-ups, add some words to our quilts, and give each of us individual attention. You will finish your project unless you want to go wild with thread painting which might take more time. This should not turn into a UFO.

Workshop Description

In this fun, creative class, you will use your imagination, fusible appliqué, conversational prints, free cutting and free motion quilting, create a small single frame scene featuring your own unique fashionistas. You will learn how to draw figures, style hair, create dresses, shoes and handbags. The project is a 12" - 14" finished piece with one or more fashionistas that is easy to complete in a day.





SUPPLY LIST FASHIONISTAS — PAPER DOLLS FOR GROWN UPS

• Sewing Machine (cleaned & oiled) with machine embroidery/free motion foot

• Fabric Scissors • Paper Scissors • Embroidery or smaller scissors that allow you to cut detail • Thread snips

- Paper, pen and pencil Pins Rotary Cutter
- Rotary Cutting Mat (small is fine. your finished piece will not be larger than 12" square)
- Rotary Cutting Ruler. If you have a 12.5" square, bring it
- Assorted Thread including black and decorative if you have any
- Pressing Sheet Disappearing Ink or Chalk Pen 1/2 yard Wonder-Under 805
- 1/2 yard white felt (this is your batting)
- Fabric lots of small pieces of conversational printed (flowers, fashion accessories, props, dogs, cats, etc. Note figure is approximately 5" head to toe)

• A selection of approximately 14 x 14 or larger solid or neutral monochromatic print for background (cotton, polished cotton, silk dupioni)

- A selection of approximately 3"x5" or larger printed "dress fabric"
- 14 x 14 or larger print for back with matching thread for bobbin



Why take the Virtual Getaway Workshop?

We selected a fun upbeat workshop, January 17 for the virtual getaway this year. It deliberately does not involve lots of new skills or a challenging pattern. Probably you have everything you need on hand with the exception of a piece of Pellon. Our thinking was this is a trying year, doing a virtual getaway was going to be challenging in and of itself. We need to be supportive of each other as well as supportive of ourselves. How can we best do that? Be with each other in a different way that is safe. I urge you to take this workshop to make a mini quilt that can hang on your work area at the next real live getaway. Sign up by the end of 2020 and take advantage of the early bird price of \$40 it will be \$50 after January first. Send you check to Marian Bressel to reserve your spot.
