2021 CPM FYN Sale (Fabric, Yarn & Notion), Nov. 6

It's happening, if all goes well!! Joan Kerpelman and Kitty Shaw are planning to hold a FYN Sale (formerly known as the Yard Sale) on Saturday, November 6th. *Save the Date!*

We are sure that you have had ample time to sort through your stash over the past 12 months and have set aside any items you want to donate to our FYN sale. We thank you for that. At a later time, we will send along instructions for measuring and marking your fabric before donation. This will help us sort the fabric quickly without having to spend time measuring.

We hope to start accepting donations in mid-June, weekly, from Thursday to Noon on Friday only. This may change depending on the Church's status at that time.

We would like to limit donated magazines to no older than from 2015, and Fleece to a minimum of 1/4 yd,

Because of limited space for storing our donation, we can't accept the following:

- * No upholstery fabric
- * No patterns, other than quilting patterns
- * No wool fabric
- * No Polyester fabric

Please be considerate and donate items in good condition, not damaged, soiled or containing mildew.

We hope to hold sorting of donated items every other Tuesday beginning late July until the sale.

Please notice that this is our **first fund raiser** since the pandemic, and we need to raise a lot of income to make up for our cash outflow this past year. So, we need your donations and your help.

Please remember that this is all tentative pending any issues with Covid-19 virus. Thanks in advance for your help.

As a suggestion for a giving option this month, consider tossing a box of period supplies in with your grocery shopping and when you drive near St Matthew's (where we have our quilt shows and yardage sales), dropping it in their collection bin: Saint Matthew's in Acton has launched March Matters.

For the month of March, we are collecting women's sanitary items to donate. There will be a bin identified with a Dignity Matters sign right just inside our front and back double doors. The priority currently is for sanitary pads/tampons (any kind) and incontinence items such as Poise or Depends (or store brands). New underwear (with store tags) and new or slightly used bras in all sizes & styles & brands are also needed.

Household Goods Sewing Kits

There is an ongoing project for creating sewing kits for Household Goods in Acton. We are especially looking for scissors and tape measures right now. But the following is the full list:

Sturdy containers (metal, plastic) with lids to hold the supplies, tape measures, scissors (particularly 6" or less, though all sizes are fine. No pinking shears please), thread (any color, partial spools are fine), pins, safety pins, needles, or buttons that you are going to throw away. Also useful are very tiny boxes for pins, and bobbins or small embroidery floss cardboard organizers to wind thread on.

Please - no general crafting supplies, however.
