

Betsy Habich is the guest speaker for our April 27th Meeting. "Fusible Applique + Surface Design = Fun"

A trunk show and power point; how her work translates from photographs, develops a pattern, and then translates that pattern to an art piece.

Betsy's work has earned awards at regional quilt shows including the Vermont Quilt Festival, The Gathering, and Machine Quilters Expo (MQX), and has been juried into national and regional shows, including International Quilt Association (IQA/Houston), American Quilters Society (AQS/Paducah). She has taught at Fiber College of Maine, Connections Quilt Festival, and at guilds, and has had several solo shows at local shows, shops, and libraries. She lives with her husband, three cats, and a happy studio full of fabric and thread in Beverly Farms, MA.

"I love the moment when my students 'get it' and start to fly on their own!" to that end Betsy will be leading a workshop for us on May 20th Titled " Surface Design + Fusible Applique Play Date". Starting with fusible fabrics to design a Hibiscus Flower, then adding Inktense blocks and pencils, Neocolor II water-soluble crayons, Aquarelle watercolor pencils, Tsukinekko inks, Liquitex acrylic media to enhance the flowers realism. Workshop fee is \$40 with a kit fee of \$35, which includes, pattern, freezer paper, parchment paper and the use of instructor's media. (Basic supply list will be available at guild meetings prior to the workshop or by e-mailing Sue Millman)

Household Goods Sewing Kits

This is an ongoing project for making sewing kits for Household Goods in Acton. We are especially looking for scissors and tape measures right now. But the following is the full list:

Sturdy containers (metal, plastic) with lids to hold the supplies, tape measures, scissors (particularly 6" or less, though all sizes are fine. (No pinking shears please), thread*** (any color, partial spools are fine), pins, safety pins, needles, and buttons that you are going to throw away. Also useful are very tiny boxes for pins, and bobbins or small embroidery floss cardboard organizers to wind thread on.

***Partial spools of thread - all types, colors are VERY welcome. Some of the thread only needs enough length to sew on a few buttons or make a hem. Please - no general crafting supplies, however.
