

Timna will be sharing her rarely seen quilts at our March meeting, but our workshop will focus on developing the techniques to create a mosaic quilt using one of your own pictures. ## Textured Black and White Baby Mats

Textured Mats for the neo-natal unit at Emerson Hospital, the special care nursery, are made by our guild for these tiny babies who cannot see color yet, but can feel texture as they lie on them. We have come up with a size and plan, but of course you can do lots of other designs. We use 5" squares, or charms, that are black and/or white. We usually use half 100% cotton and half textured, that is suede, flannel, lace, taffeta, silk, satin, whatever you can think of that provides texture. Our quilts are made using 30 squares, sewn in a 5x6 arrangement, then sandwiched with batting, and then backing, usually flannel. We quilt simply (because lots of the textured fabrics are stretchy), either stitch in the ditch or 1/4" either side of the seam. Then fold the backing to the front as an enclosing edge and add a label. I can make you a kit, or I can give you just the textured fabrics, or anything in between. Let me know if I can bring you a kit.
