Your name tag for those of us who forget our own names.

A treat for about 10 starving quilters. Can't put it on the stove.

We will supply sandwiches, coffee, tea and water. Lunch arrives around noon. We can use salads and other non-stove needing things. And don't forget the chocolate!

Proposed Bylaw Change – Associate Membership Category

The Board has voted to discontinue the Associate Membership category. It no longer applies to the guild and it serves no purpose. The benefits of full and associate memberships are the same except for voting rights. Associate members cannot vote on guild business. The Associate category was developed many years ago, when newsletters and membership books were mailed rather than emailed and associates did not get the mailings. Associates were only allowed to exhibit in the Quilt Show if there was space available. We have not had space issues in recent years. Associates are also supposed to pay a \$5 fee to attend meetings, and we have been erratic in collecting the fees.

The Bylaw Committee will review this proposal and if accepted, will present it to the membership. We will vote on the bylaws change at the April meeting.

Quilts 250: Stitching in the Spirit of Democracy

We've entered the final stretch in preparing for this collaborative show effort! Our lecture with Gerald Roy and Jennifer Swope has a title: *American Quilts: The Art and Story of a Nation.*

Quilts 250 has accepted 232 entries to be in our show. Why only 232 quilts? Many beautiful quilts entered were large quilts, which require more pipe and drape dedicated to a single quilt. To stay within our budget, the number of quilts had to be reduced. With comfort quilts being displayed in our entryway, we'll probably still be "exhibiting" 250 quilts!

The next phase of publicity for the show focuses on attendance! Attached is a preview of our newest postcards which are currently in print. They will feature four quilts from the show. What you see is a draft. Minor changes have been made to the text. The cards feature a QR code which will take you to more information and will feature a link where advance ticket sales for the lecture by Gerald Roy and Jennifer Swope can be purchased. I'm hoping that feature will be complete by the time you receive this newsletter! We will also make a flyer that you can download and send to friends.

A note about hanging quilts at the Q250 event:

The Q250 event will use Quilters' Connection's method of hanging quilts. This means every quilt will need a hanging slat to fit the sleeve which has smallish holes drilled near the upper corners, and possibly in the center for extra support for larger quilts. Don't panic. Basic wood slats strong enough to support the quilt weight are easy to get and trim to fit your quilts. Some of our members are also QC members who might even be able to match one of their slats with your quilt if you ask. You might even have slats available if you have a woodworker in the family. We can talk about this at the meeting and at the Getaway since it is a new method for most CPM members.
